SCORING THE FALL OF RIDER AT THE BEGINNER NOVICE AND NOVICE LEVELS.

With the recent change of EV141.1.b.1 & .2, allowing, under certain circumstances, one fall of at the beginner novice and novice levels, scoring exactly what occurred is not (in many cases) accurately being depicted on the results. Below are examples of what could occur at these levels and how, and when, the 65 penalties and/or RF should be reported. This formula applies to jump judge/master jump sheets and results. Any of the below scenarios could include additional jump penalties that may have been incurred. In that case add those penalty as usual.

Rider, falls remains standing and continues – 65 penalties for the fall.
